
Contributing to the education of the youth in the area was an obvious choice for the family.

What is the Trey Purdie Memorial Scholarship?

The Scholarship is a \$1,000.00 award to a student who will be furthering their education following his/her graduation from high school.

Who is eligible to apply for the Scholarship?

There are two separate scholarship pots of \$1,000.00 eligible students may apply for:

1. Applicants must reside on a working farm or ranch, & be a Red Deer County Resident.
2. Applicants must be in good standing with the AHSRA and graduating from high school

What is the criteria to receive the award?

Applications are weighted on the following criteria:

- **Application Essay (30%)**
- **Reference Letters (30%)**
- **School/Community and AHSRA Involvement and Achievements (20%)**
- **Academics (20%)**

Successful applicants are permitted to defer for one year.



How and when to apply:

Applications are available on the Red Deer & District Community Foundation's website at www.rddcf.ca, through the Alberta High School Rodeo Association or at a Chinook's Edge School Division High School as well as Red Deer High Schools.

Students will be able to access Trey Purdie Memorial Scholarship applications between the months of January and March and award recipients will be announced by June of each year.
